When and How to Qualify for an Application:

- Cumulative weighted and unweighted GPAs of sophomores and juniors will be pulled every year at the end of the first semester
- Cadets with a 3.75 GPA at that time will receive an application

What we look for in our applicants:

- *Scholarship* Cadets have a 3.75 GPA or higher and continually challenge themselves in academics
- *Leadership* Cadets should take on as many leadership roles in and out of school as possible (athletics, clubs, in the classroom, within the Naval Science Dept., in the community, etc.)
- *Service* Cadets go above and beyond the recommended annual Naval Science Community Service requirements
- **Character** Cadets exhibit integrity and honesty in and out of the classroom and refrains from any behavior unbecoming of a cadet

Induction

• Upon acceptance (as determined by the NHS Faculty Committee), DMA hosts a National Honor Society Induction Ceremony for new members each year.

<u>Membership</u>

An NHS member:

- pays annual dues of \$15 and signs a membership agreement form
- maintains the qualifying GPA and upholds all requirements from the application
- attends monthly meetings
- can apply to be an NHS Officer in their second year in the program
- participates in an annual NHS service project
- graduates with honors, denoted by an NHS graduation stole at the graduation ceremony
