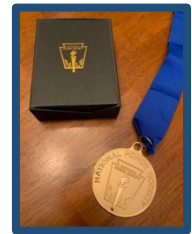


Extra-Curricular and Co-Curricular Activities at DMA

National Honor Society

DMA's National Honor Society is an elite group of carefully-selected cadets who have demonstrated superiority in not only academics, but in leadership, service, and character. To become eligible, a cadet must have a 3.75 cumulative GPA in their sophomore or junior year. They then fill out an application and are selected by a faculty committee. Members who are selected participate in community service, tutor fellow cadets, take on leadership positions, and go above and beyond in all aspects of student life.

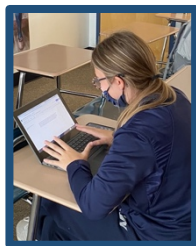


Student Government Association

The Porthole (DMA Yearbook) and the Scuttlebutt (DMA Newspaper)

The DMA yearbook 'The Porthole', and the newspaper 'The Scuttlebutt', are both products of the Journalism elective that is held during the mini-block. As part of the course, cadets are tasked with writing articles for the newspaper that is released in 4 issues



throughout the school year. The yearbook is a culmination of the school year and all that it has encompassed to share with the school community. Cadets learn the importance of 'Journalistic Integrity', proper photography set-up and design, and the overall production process of publishing the yearbook as the summative project for the year.



Junior Ring Committee
