These assessments are used to measure student readiness for college and to identify a student's potential for success in advanced placement courses. This voluntary test allows students the opportunity to qualify for National Merit Scholarships. An additional benefit of participating in this assessment is that Khanacademy.org will create a personalized practice program for students based on their performance.

The Delaware Military Academy hosts an Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) for all 11th grade cadets in the spring (DMA required). The purpose of this three hour long, pencil/paper assessment is to help predict future academic and occupational success in the military. Students taking this assessment are not required to enter into the military. For students who will be entering other post-secondary options, this test serves as a career assessment tool that can help students identify possible future careers. Additionally, due to a correlation between the ASVAB and SAT assessment, preparation for the ASVAB will serve to benefit students in regards to SAT performance. The Delaware System of Student Assessment (DeSSA) is administered annually to measure student achievement on content standards. 11th grade students will take the Delaware Social Studies Assessment. Additionally, student enrolled in Biology (regardless of grade level) will take the Delaware Next Generation Science Assessment. Both assessments are administered online in the spring between the months of March and May (state requirement) and are untimed. Assessment results are mailed home for each student.
